Essential medicines out of stock – 10 December 2009

LAHORE, Dec 9: Some essential medicines are not available in the market all over province.

According to wholesale medicine dealers and retailers in Lahore, three essential medicines -- thyroxin (for thyroid glands), zyloric (for uric acid) and panadol (painkiller) -- are short throughout Punjab because of their economical rates. For example, a retailer says a pack of 100 tablets of thyroxin is available at Rs30. "Since its supply is short the pack is being sold up to Rs200," he said, pointing out that pharmaceuticals had created artificial shortage in order to increase the sale of alternative medicines which were expensive.
