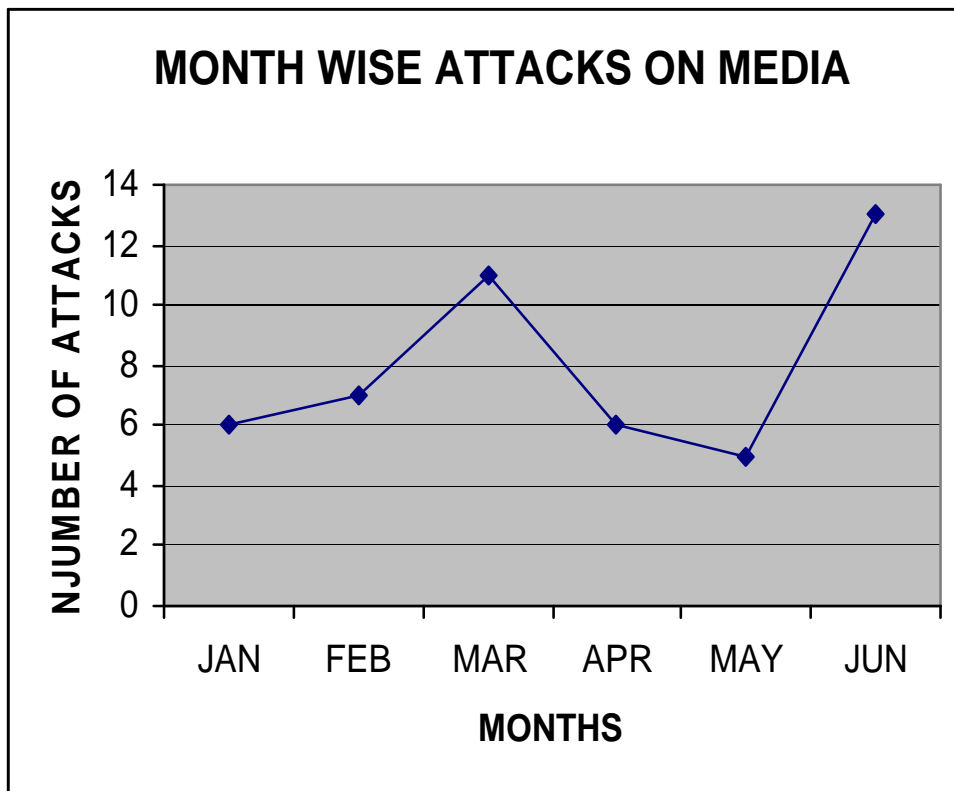

FOREWORD

Internews, an international non-government organization operational in over 40 countries, supports open media worldwide. Internews Pakistan is working to strengthen freedom of expression in Pakistan by building a substantial online Media Resource Centre that monitors violations against media and provide journalists with knowledge and expertise on legal coverage (www.internews.org.pk)

HIGHLIGHTS OF REPORT

Internews is presenting the report 'Media Freedom Statistics' for the January –June 30, 2006, which is based on incidents of attacks and intimidation perpetrated on media. The incidents were reported in the various national newspapers and were confirmed through media bodies.

Media in Pakistan faced at least 48 recorded incidents of attacks and harassment during the first half (Jan 1 – Jun 30) of the current year in which two journalists were murdered and 28 attacked or tortured.

Statistics compiled from Pakistani print media by Internews, an international NGO working to promote open media worldwide, reveal that in these 48 incidents a total of 66 journalists were the victims of which 25 were kidnapped or detained and 11 faced harassment or threats. The murdered journalists include Munir Ahmed Sangi of Kawish Television Network and Hayatullah Khan of The Nation who were killed in Sindh province and the Federally Administered Tribal Areas respectively.

The analysis shows a disturbing trend of increasing incidents of violence against media persons and media property in Pakistan. In January 2006 there were six incidents and in June the number of attacks had risen to 13. During the period under review six attacks and raids by government and political groups on media property were reported including press clubs at Peshawar, Khairpur and Quetta.

Geographically Sindh proved to be the most dangerous region in Pakistan to practice journalism with 29 journalists victimized followed by 17 in tribal areas, 11 in Punjab and seven in North West Frontier Province. Two journalists from the Northern Areas were also victims of harassment.

The brunt of physical attacks and threats was faced by the print media where 52 journalists were at the receiving end while 14 electronic media journalists also coming under attack during the first six months of 2006.

The most prominent incident of violence was the killing of Hayatullah Khan, who was kidnapped on December 5, 2005 and found dead on June 16, 2006 in Mirali, a town in North Waziristan with bullet wounds to his head.

BACKGROUND

Definition: “Violation against media occurs, when an influential person, organization or government agency tries to influence a media personal (reporter, editor, photo journalist or camera personal) or organization, like newspaper, TV & radio channel, Press Club, media installations or equipment in order to threaten, harass or intimidate him/her to prevent him or her from discharging professional duties.

The report includes incidents of murder of journalists, attempts on life, detentions, abduction, torture, harassment and threats and damage to the media equipment or properties.

Despite the fact that the media rarely reports about such incidents for many reasons the following report focuses on those incidents which did get reported in various national newspapers and TV channels. There may still be many cases that might not have been reported by the press.

Apart from government agencies every other influential person including politicians, businessmen, religious groups, and extremist militant outfits try to influence media contents in Pakistan.

METHODOLOGY

Mainly five categories of attack on media were identified to record information. These include murder, abduction, torture and harassment or threats.

Original newspaper cuttings of all the incidents of violations against media were also compiled and recorded.

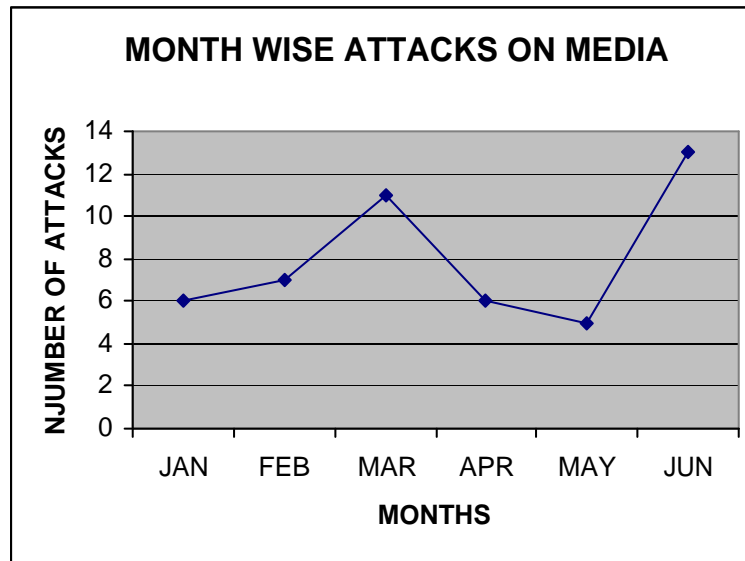

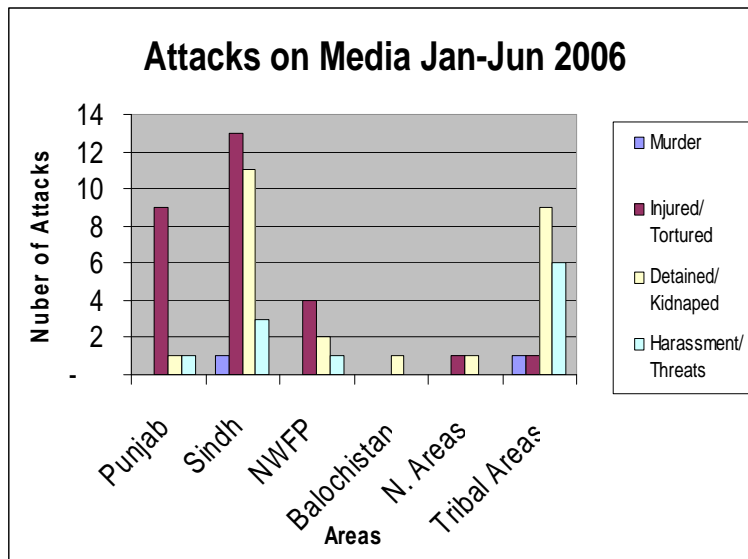

Explanation: A total 48 incidents of violence against media have been recorded during the first six months of the year 2006 and 100 % increase recorded in attacks on media in the short span of six months. During January 6 attacks reported while in June 2006, a total 13 attacks on media were reported through out the country. Seven attacks were reported in February, 11 in March and 6 attacks in April while 5 act of violence against media were observed in May 2006.

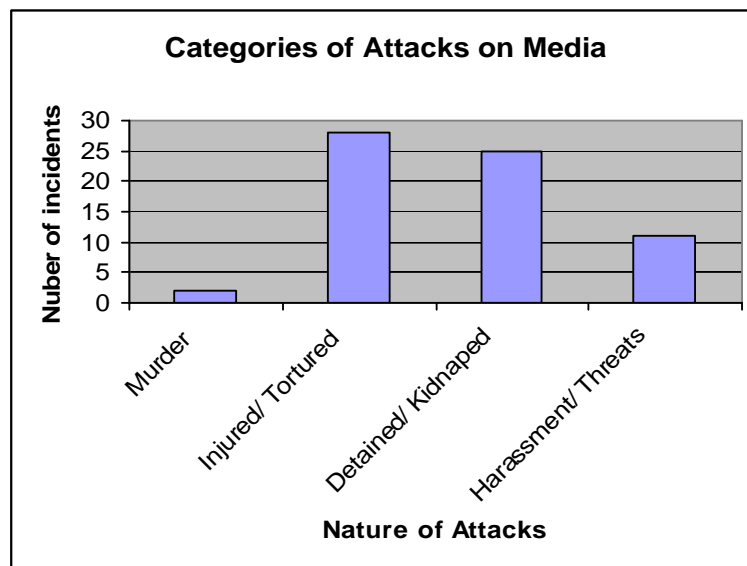

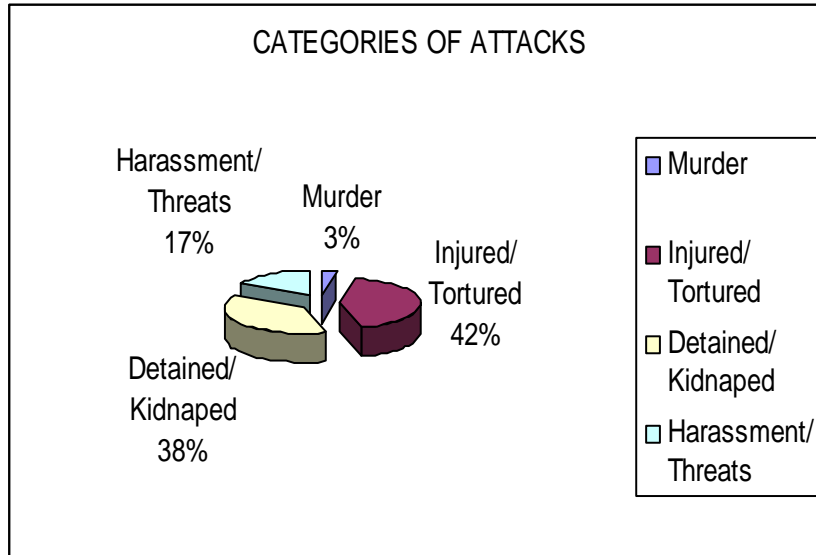

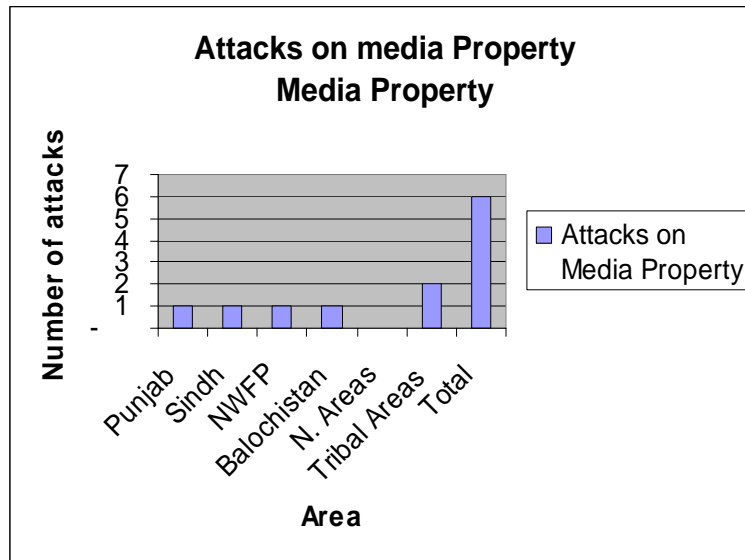

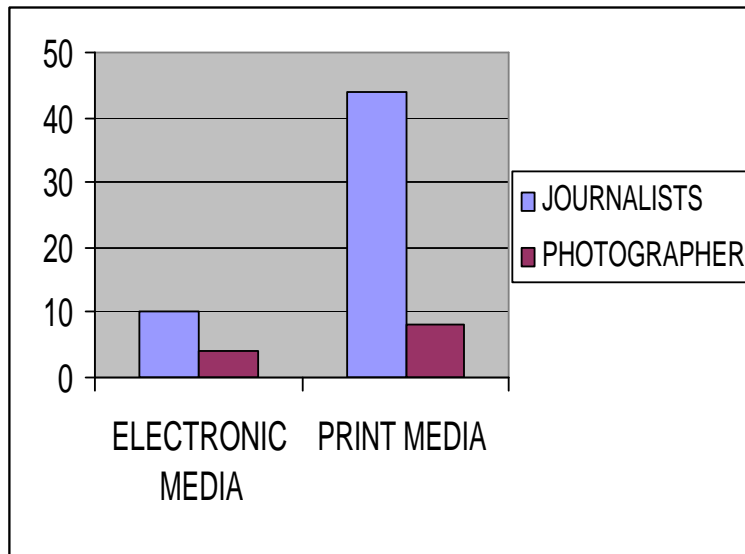
